2022 Tassie Masters



A funny thing happened on the way to the Tassie Masters.

A trip to Tassie; a chance to play at the Eastside courts that Ross Barnden invited me to so often; a guided tour and an excursion organised to Port Arthur on the Friday morning; a stress-free break in Hobart with flights and accommodation booked by Michelle for us; Jan & James are definitely in.

A wake-up call at 3.30 and courtesy bus to the airport to meet with fellow travellers: driver Rob Sims, Neil Tytler, Gary McPyke, Allison Douglas, Darren O'Neill, Michelle Rowles, Anne Fordham, Lori Fernandez, Greg Murphy and cheerleader Donna Fisher (recovering from injury).What could possibly go wrong!?!?!?

After nearly half an hour standing in line for a hot chocolate and coffee for myself a glance at the flight departure board shows "FLIGHT CANCELLED". Back to the group and Michelle and Allison are already at the service centre, (an anonymous voice whispered they were snarling and snapping) at the JetStar staff. Heading the list is Melbourne's Peter Gilbee who was a finalist at the 2018 World Masters Squash championships in Charlottesville, USA. Gilbee will also be one of three players to represent Australia in a Trans-Tasman series later this year.

VMSA tournament director Darren O'Neill said Gilbee was one of several topline Masters players competing at Horsham for the first time this weekend.

Others included Tasmania's Tim Shaw, Mildura's Kevin Healy, Geelong's Corey Robertson, Ballarat's Darren O'Donnell and Bendigo gun Cam Penna. O'Neill said Melbourne players Mark Ascoli and Mick Dyke, who were finalists the last time Horsham hosted the Masters, would also return.

TRANS-TASMAN SERIES 2022

A big congratulations to Victoria's three representatives at the 2022 Trans Tasman Series held in Adelaide during the Australian Masters Championships.

These players contributed to Australia's overall win at this year's event. You have done Victoria proud.

Brief History of the Trans Tasman Series After the success of two unofficial tours by Australian Masters players to NZ in 1982 and 1983, a meeting, under the Chairmanship of the Australian Squash Rackets Association (ASRA) President, Mr Vic Belsham, was held in Brisbane on 28 April 1984 between the ASRA Executive and representatives of the New Zealand Squash Rackets Association (NZSRA) with the object of the meeting being to rationalise the program of events between the two countries going forward. An item on the Agenda was the question of an official Masters Teams Series between the two countries. It was agreed that the inaugural official Teams Series would commence with a visit by New Zealand to Australia in Sept 1984. The Series was conducted on the Gold Coast during the Australian Individual Championships at Southport. The Trans Tasman Series was conducted on an annual basis (1984 to 1993). Apart from some slight variations in the calendar between 1995 and 2000 due to World Championships. The Trans Tasman Series has been conducted on a Biennial basis since 2001. There have been (24) Trans Tasman Series conducted since 1984 with Australia winning 20 and NZ 4.

The **2023 Mountain District Open Squash Championships** will run from Friday February 3rd to Sunday Feb 5th 2023. This'll be our first MD squash tournament since January 2022. It's a great local event, with grades for all standards. Entry forms will be available by December 1st.


