Benalla's Courts 4 Sports Project Update

As many of you know, the squash community has been pushing for 14 years to get more squash courts built in Benalla. Many of you wonderful people have helped along the way and been interested in how Courts 4 Sports has been progressing.

Beginning in 2010 the Benalla Squash & Racquetball Association was formed to get more courts built in Benalla. Soon after we got community support and support from the wider squash community and the local council was also in support. Within a few years the community and Benalla Rural City Council had decided that the best site for these courts would be at the Benalla Indoor Recreation Centre (BIRC) as a part of it's redevelopment. Redevelopment of BIRC with squash courts built in it was written in to the Benalla Rural City Council's "Recreation Strategic Plan, 2015". Same was also written in to the Council's "Council Plan 2017-2021" and again in the "Council Plan 2021-2025".

In 2017 Council allocated \$10,000 to progress the project and the "Benalla Rural City, Benalla Indoor Recreation Centre Master Plan" was published in 2019, which had concept plans and costings for the redevelopment that included 6 squash courts.

In 2022 the Labour Government pledged \$15 million towards the BIRC redevelopment project which included our 6 new squash courts.

So all was set to go; the support was there, the plans were there, the money was provided.

Recently the Benalla Rural City Council not only announced that the BIRC may not be the site of the redevelopment, but the new Indoor Sporting Stadium that the \$15 million will be used to build may not necessarily have squash courts included in it at all. They say that community consultation now needs to be sought to decide what is included in the new Stadium.

Not surprisingly we are very annoyed and exceedingly frustrated that after all these years of effort and being promised 6 squash courts as a 'priority project" our Council now tell us that there is no assurance squash courts will even be built. We see this as a major backward step that we now have to canvass the Council to convince them squash courts need to be built, after all these years of being promised them.

Be that as it may, we cannot seem to get the Council to assure us of courts and figure that the best way to convince council to include them is by a good old fashioned petition.

So we appeal to you and all of the squash community to sign our petition to get our 6 squash courts built in Benalla.

Please share it to others though.

The council will decide after the end of March what is going to be included in the new stadium, so please get on to this straight away as there is some urgency. Please hurry up and sign and share and pass on the word so we can get as many signatures as possible. Thank you.

Vale Chris "Furry" Fuhrmeister

It is with huge regret that our friend Chris Fuhrmeister was taken from us on February 8th this year. He leaves behind his wife Dianne, three daughters Brooke, Erin and Hannah, five grandchildren and countless friends. You couldn't be his friend without admiring him. In fact, you couldn't even know him without some admiration for him. Ask anyone to describe him and invariably the word 'fun' would appear in the explanation.

Affectionately known as Furry, well known and respected and perhaps should have been known as the 'funmeister'. He brought people together, a delight to be around and created fun in a social setting for those fortunate enough to be in his company. As was one of his mottos, he could make something out of nothing; especially fun. He made normal things special. He was non-judgmental, accepted all and made them feel welcome. He liked music and dancing and who could forget his standard uniform of the bright and colourful Hawaiian-style shirts.

His early life was lived in the outer suburbs of Melbourne, later to have a cattle farm near Geelong. He didn't start playing squash until his early adult years in 1974 but it became his passion. A few years later he and Dianne got married. Moving to Lakes Entrance he bought the squash courts there in 1990. He ran the courts for 30 years and also took up racquetball somewhere along the way. He promoted these sports tirelessly over the years. He sold the courts in 2021 – the end of an era.

He ran the Lakes Classic tournament for almost 30 years and later created the 'Funament' tournament as a fundraiser for prostate cancer research. He assisted others in squash and racquetball wherever and whenever he could. He often managed to fill a minibus with participants for the Maffra tournament, most of them junior players. Don't know how many Hopman Cup teams he gathered together and competed in, but the highlight was his East Gippsland team winning Division 1, Hopman Cup in 2017.

He was a role model for many; on the court, behind the court and away from the court. He impacted and touched other people's lives and always in a positive way. He was influential. People wanted to know him, people wanted him to know them. They wanted people to know they knew him and that he knew them. He was a role model for many.

Some people like to say someone is 'larger than life', that is a bit cliché, Furry is a bit too humble for that. More to say he lived a normal life, but lived it large! He lived his life his way, and all around him liked the way he lived it and were happy to be a part of it.

Sadly he died at 68 years old, far too early for someone who had so much to give. He did not get to have a 'five setter', his match may have only gone to four, but he won and he played it well.

Our condolences go out to all his family on losing such a well regarded man. He is and will continue to be missed.
